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

While my husband (who had recently been diagnosed with a seizure disorder) was looking for work and volunteering, I was at home raising our four school-age children, with no prior work history or a GED.

We were on the TANF program for temporary assistance. I tag-teamed with my husband to do volunteer jobs, a requirement for receiving assistance. I learned about the Bean Project from a family member so I went and applied.

During the application process, I learned about the program, the products they produce and the work they do. We had a working "hands-on" interview with a team of five.

Once I completed the interview process, I waited for the phone call to see if I was accepted into the program.

empowering women one bean at a time

It's an exciting time of year at Women's Bean Project. Our last group of program participants just graduated and 100% of them have found permanent employment in their field of choice! We have been actively recruiting new applicants to join our 9-month transitional employment program and are hosting a large group hiring event to bring on 40 new women who have faced various barriers to employment.



We hire women who come from all walks of life and different backgrounds

who are struggling to get or keep a job. These women develop hands-on job training by working in our food manufacturing and jewelry businesses. In conjunction, the women attend program activities that are designed to help them develop life skills for long-term success. Our goal is to empower each individual woman to change her life and to create a better future for herself, her family, our community and our economy.

Cranberry-Orange Brownies

Take our yummy Cindy's Sinfully Chocolate Brownie Mix and add a little orange, Craisins and walnuts for these scrumptious and delicious treat.



🟅 I package Cindy's Sinfully Chocolate Brownie Mix

3 4 oz. butter 3 1/2 cup Craisins

2 eggs 2 d oz. white chocolate

To cup walnuts of Orange zest from one orange

3 4 teaspoons orange liquor

Start by grinding the walnuts in a food processor until they are very fine. Grease an 8" x 8" x 2" pan with nonstick spray. Firmly press the walnuts into the bottom of the pan to create a crust. For the brownies, start by melting the butter; place it in a medium mixing bowl, add the mix and two eggs. Next, zest one orange into a the bowl with the brownies, and add the orange liquor. Using a spatula, mix everything together by hand, and pour the mixture into the pan with the walnut crust. Bake in a 350 degree oven until the brownies start to pull away from the sides or a toothpick comes out clean — approximately 25-30 minutes. Cool on a cooling rack for about 15 minutes. Finally, melt 4 oz. of white chocolate and drizzle over the top of the brownies. Cool until the chocolate hardens. Cut and enjoy!


